Weeks 1–4: God Sends His Son

In these Christmas-theme lessons, children will learn that God chose Mary to be the mother of His Son, that Jesus is God's Son, that angels told about the birth of Jesus, and that the shepherds visited the manger after Jesus was born. Children will realize that they, too, can tell others about Jesus.

Weeks 5–13: David Pleases God

Nine stories from the life of young David will illustrate ways that children can please God. The lessons will repeatedly emphasize the basic truths of helping and obeying and will give children opportunities to practice these behaviors.

Luke 1:26–38
