Conquering the Land Judges in the Land

Notes to the Teacher

1. This book has been prepared for primary children. The book is perforated so you can tear out each sheet, complete it in class, and send it home with the child. Each page includes directions for completing the activities on that page.
2. The parent letter is on page 3. Send this page home with the child on the first Sunday of the quarter or deliver it personally before the quarter begins. Page 4 contains an overview of this quarter's lessons, along with a list of all the memory verses.
3. If a child is absent, make sure he receives his handwork sheet and the Strong Kids at Home take-home paper. This will help him review the Bible lesson he missed.

Using the Handwork Sheets

The first page of each lesson contains a Lesson Review section. This is an opportunity to review the previous week's lesson. As children arrive to class, let them work on the activity about five minutes into class time. Make sure the children's names are on their papers before you collect them.

You will use the handwork sheets again at the end of the lesson. The children will work on the activities on the back of the sheets. As they work, discuss the Bible story or its application. Let children do as much as time permits, but if they cannot complete the page in class, allow them to take it home and finish it.

An exciting quarter of studies await your child in the summer quarter for primaries! Your child will learn about some incredible accounts from the books of Joshua and Judges. It will be quite the action-packed adventure—city walls crumble to the ground, the sun stands still in the sky, a small army defeats a huge army without using any weapons, and more!

Unit 1 will pick up with the Israelites' journey into the Promised Land. Moses has died and Joshua is in command. The lessons follow the Israelites as God helps them conquer the enemies within the Promised Land. The Israelites suffer losses and celebrate victories in various battles. In every circumstance, God is faithful to His promise to be with His People when they follow Him, as well as His promise to judge their sin when they disobey.

The second unit will introduce your child to the judges, people God used to encourage the Israelites' faith and to rescue them from captivity. Even though the Israelites repeatedly found themselves in trouble because of their sin, God keeps His promise and sends a deliverer every time they return to Him. Your child will be encouraged to have faith in the powerful God Who deserves our trust and obedience.

Review your child's worksheet with him and set aside time each week to help him memorize his Bible memory verse, listed on the back of this sheet. He will need to recite the current week's verse the following week in Sunday School.

Help your child go through the Strong Kids at Home take-home paper every week. Each paper is full of stories and fun activities that reinforce the lesson. Use the Parent Connect section in each paper to support the spiritual growth themes at home.

Thank you for the opportunity to teach your child Biblical truths. We are praying for his spiritual growth.

Quarter Overview

Conquering the Land Weeks 1—6

In unit 1, students will continue their study of the Israelites' journey into the Promised Land. With Joshua as their leader, the Israelites learn to have faith in God as He helps them conquer the land. Though the Israelites often disobey God, they are encouraged to trust God and follow Him because He is both powerful and just. Students will be encouraged as they learn that God will use them, and that He will help them do His will.

Judges in the Land Weeks 7—13

Unit 2 introduces students to the Old Testament judges. Though the Israelites sinned against God, God was still faithful to His promises—both to be with His People and to judge their sin. God used individuals to judge the Israelites, deliver them from their enemies, and to encourage God's People to obey Him. Students will learn that God gave the judges what they needed to be able to do His will. The lessons will emphasize serving God and having faith in Him.

Lesson 13


