
Knack for Navigating

Ships need special guides called pilots for navigating the complex waterways around a bay. Pilot your ship to the correct delivery location.

Begin at 73 Seagull Way. Sail west one nautical mile, then north 5 miles. Then steer east 2 miles. Your destination is on the north side. What is it?

Begin at 520 Walrus Way. Sail south 2 nautical miles, then west 8 miles. Then go north 3 miles. Steer east 2 miles; your destination is on the north side.

Play a game with a friend or family member. Take turns navigating. One player chooses a starting point and destination. He or she tells the starting point and gives directions. The other player must navigate to the destination.

- Jonah's name means "dove" or "pigeon" in Hebrew.
- Jonah lived in Gath Hepher, less than 5 miles from Nazareth, where Jesus later grew up.
- Jonah was a real person and is mentioned in four other passages of the Bible—2 Kings 14:25; Matthew 12:39–41; Matthew 16:4; and Luke 11:29–32. The events in Jonah, including all miracles, were real, historical events.
- The Bible records only one prophet of Israel being sent to a Gentile nation with an offer of mercy. Jonah is that prophet.
