Notes to the Teacher

1. Remove the letter to parents from the front of each student book and sign each letter. Distribute the letter to the parents of each child in your class on or before the first Sunday of the quarter.
2. In preparation for the quarter, you may want to take apart all the student books and cut around the stickers. Put all the lesson 1 sheets and stickers in a folder; put all the lesson 2 sheets and stickers in another folder; continue for all thirteen lessons. This will save you time during the week.
3. If a child is absent, be sure to give that child the student book sheet (and any stickers or additional pieces) and take-home card the week following the absence.

Using the Student Book Sheets

This student book will help you review with the children the Bible lessons and memory verses. As the children work on their sheets, talk with them about the pictures. After printing a child's name on the paper, have that child repeat the Bible verse with you.

Lesson Truths

Weeks 1–4

Jesus Was Born

This Christmas emphasis includes four familiar events from Luke 2: Mary and Joseph traveling to Bethlehem, the birth of Jesus, the angels' appearance to the shepherds, and the shepherds' visit to the manger. Your child will learn that baby Jesus is God's Son and that God planned for Him to be born. Christmas is a special day because it is Jesus' birthday.

Weeks 5–8

Jesus Grew Up

Continuing with stories about Jesus, we will emphasize that Jesus grew. He did not stay a tiny baby. When the wise men saw Him, He was about two years old, and when He went to the temple with Mary and Joseph, He was twelve. Your child will learn that Jesus, God's Son, grew, just as your child is growing.

Weeks 9–13

Jesus Helped People

When Jesus performed miracles, He was a grown man. These stories about Jesus will emphasize how He helped people and had power over nature. Your child will learn that Jesus can do wonderful things because He is the Son of God.

Suggestions for Parents

It won't take long for your child to learn what the world thinks of Christmas. Make an effort to reinforce the Biblical truths about Christmas, using some of these simple ideas:

- When you receive Christmas cards featuring Bible scenes, take time to look at those cards with your child and talk about the pictures.
- Display a kid-friendly nativity set, such as the Plush Nativity Set available from rbpStore.org (product number 6683). Your child will enjoy rearranging the characters and animals again and again.
- Visit a live nativity in your community.
- Set out picture books about the birth of Jesus. Your child may want you read the books aloud or may want to only look at the pictures.
- Play recordings of Christian Christmas music produced for children, such as the CD *Our Daily Bread for Kids: Christmas*, available from rbpStore.org (product number 8779).
- Beat the consumerism and busyness of Christmas by communicating with your actions the true reason for the holiday. Instead of running out to buy one more gift, involve your family in an act of kindness. Instead of feeling stressed over baking cookies and other treats, donate food, such as ingredients for a Christmas dinner, to your church's food pantry or to a church member who needs it.
- On Christmas Day, serve a birthday cake and sing "Happy Birthday" to Jesus.

Let this Christmas be one when you reinforce the true meaning of Christmas.
