Measuring Growth

The Primary lesson for this week taught your child the concept of selfless love. Your child learned that God loves him selflessly, which was exemplified through Ruth's selfless love for Naomi. Guide your child to notice when he can be kind to someone else, even if it may be inconvenient to him.

Measurables

- 1. My child is motivated to love others because he knows God loves him.
- 2. My child thoughtfully considers what he can do to show kindness to someone else.
- 3. My child recognizes that God loves him perfectly no matter what.
