Weeks 1–4: Serving in God’s House

Hannah prayed for a son in God’s house, and then she dedicated Samuel to God’s service. The theme of serving and obeying the Lord continues when Samuel goes to live in God’s house to help Eli, the high priest. Your child will be introduced to things he or she can do in God’s house—pray, serve the Lord and His people, and listen to and obey God’s Word.

Weeks 5–8: Worshiping God’s Son

The Bible stories for this unit focus on some of the events in Jesus’ life leading up to Easter. Your child will learn of Mary’s special gift to Jesus. We’ll celebrate Jesus’ triumphal entry into Jerusalem, introduce the truth of Jesus’ death, and rejoice in His resurrection. Your child will be glad that Jesus, God’s Son, is alive in Heaven.

Weeks 9–13: Worshiping in God’s House

The Bible stories for this unit include King David’s plans for building God’s house and Solomon’s oversight of the construction. Your child will begin to realize that a church is different from other buildings. Your child will be glad to come to church to sing praises to God and to learn God’s Word.
