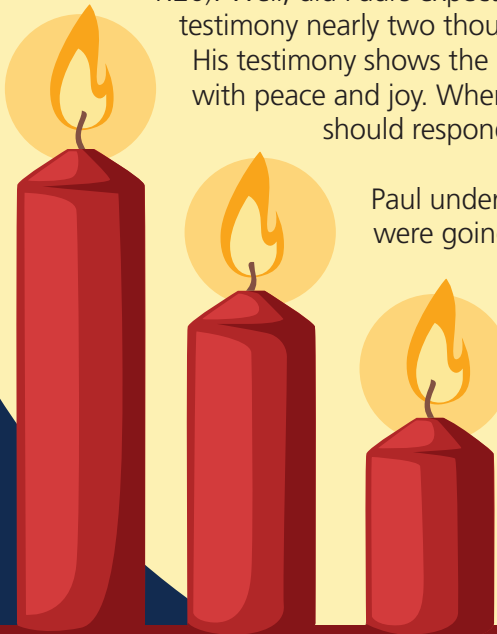


The Big Question

What if the world rejects me for glorifying God?

Rejoice! That might not be the answer you were looking for, but it is the answer the apostle Paul gave when the world rejected him. He was glad to be so effective at glorifying God that the world tried to put out his spiritual light forever by beating him, imprisoning him, and eventually putting him to death. They wanted to do all they could to keep him quiet and to keep his faith from spreading throughout the Roman Empire.

While in prison for preaching the gospel, Paul wrote to the church in Philippi. He told them that he fully expected God to be magnified through his life even if the Romans killed him for his faith in Christ (Philippians 1:20). Well, did Paul's expectations come true? Absolutely! You are reading about his strong testimony nearly two thousand years after the Romans killed him for standing for Christ. His testimony shows the power of God's grace to help a believer face strong opposition with peace and joy. When we read about all that God did through Paul's life and death, we should respond by giving glory to God!



Paul understood that the Philippians needed constant encouragement if they were going to choose to live for God's glory. That's why he told them to work together to support one another as they faced those who wanted to destroy them (Philippians 1:27).

Strong Christians friends can help you live to bring glory to God instead of yourself. Who can you encourage to live for God's glory. Who could encourage you?

Don't be fooled into believing that living for self means a worry free life. In the end, living to glorify self leads to disappointment and regret.

Case in Point

A New Season, a New Purpose

Jackson counted down the days on his calendar. Three more weeks until his first baseball practice of the spring. He loved playing baseball and being part of a team. Last year he played well on the field but didn't do so well in the dugout. He made a point not to tell any of his teammates that he is a Christian. He worried that they might reject him or make fun of him. So, when Jackson had chances to take a stand for Christ, he backed off. He joined the other players in laughing at Tom's awkward running motion. And he said a few bad words so he would sound like the other players.

This year Jackson purposed to live for God's glory instead of his own even if it meant he might become the one who was laughed at. Jackson wants his light to shine brightly so his teammates might see his good works and learn about the God they will someday answer to.

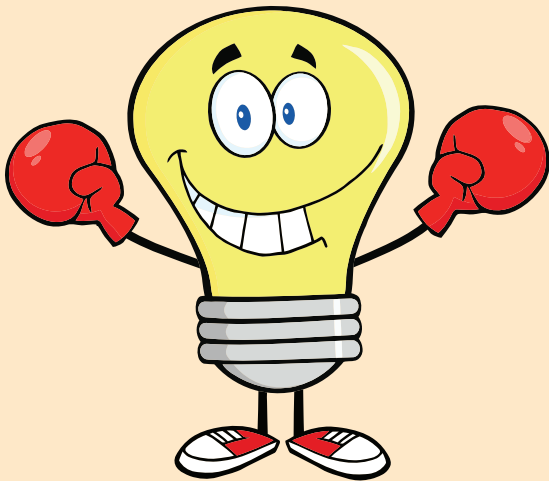
