Notes to the Teacher

- This book has been prepared for primary students.
 The book is perforated so you can tear out each sheet,
 complete it in class, and send it home with the student.
 Each page includes directions for completing the activities on that page.
- 2. The parent letter is on page 3. Send this page home with the student on the first Sunday of the quarter or deliver it personally before the quarter begins. Page 4 contains an overview of this quarter's lessons, along with a list of all the memory verses.
- 3. If a student is absent, make sure he or she receives the handwork sheet and the *Strong Kids at Home* take-home paper. This will help the student review the Bible lesson.

Using the Handwork Sheets

The first page of each lesson contains a Lesson Review section. This is an opportunity to review the previous week's lesson. As students arrive to class, let them work on the activity about five minutes into class time. Make sure the students' names are on their papers before you collect them.

You will use the handwork sheets again at the end of the lesson. The students will work on the activities on the back of the sheets. As they work, discuss the Bible story or its application. Let students do as much as time permits, but if they cannot complete the page in class, allow them to take it home and finish it.

Thank you for bringing your child to Sunday School!
The spring quarter study for primary students focuses on God's forgiveness.
Spring is a beautiful reminder of the new life Jesus came to give us. Because of Jesus' death and resurrection, we have the opportunity to experience forgiveness from sin and eternal life in Heaven with God.

In the first unit, your child will learn why Jesus is the only One Who could pay the penalty for sin. While Jesus was on earth, He healed people both physically and spiritually. Only God could do that. And because Jesus is fully God, He is sinless and holy—the perfect, sacrificial Lamb of God. Through His death and resurrection, we can now receive forgiveness from sin.

During the last five weeks of the quarter, your child will learn about the Israelites' disobedience and failure to trust God. Throughout these accounts, two truths are revealed about God in His response to His People's sin: God is just and God is merciful. Your child will study how God deals with sin justly. But God also responds with abundant mercy, as shown in His faithfulness toward His People.

Discuss the worksheet with your child each week. Set aside time each week to help your child review the Bible memory verse, listed on the back of this sheet. Your child will need to recite the current week's verse the following week in Sunday School.

Encourage your child to read the *Strong Kids at Home* take-home paper and complete the fun activities. Go through the Parent Connect section in each paper to help reinforce the spiritual growth themes at home.

As we enter the season of the year when we celebrate Easter, we are so thankful for the opportunity to present truths about Jesus Christ to your child. Thank you for the opportunity to partner with you in the spiritual growth of your child.

Quarter Overview

Israel Rejects God's Promised Son Weeks 1—8

Unit 1 reinforces the truth of Who Jesus is—the sinless, perfect, Son of God. Students will learn from Jesus' example as they study His temptation, how He served, and His obedience to the Father's will. Understanding that only Jesus qualifies to be the Savior from sin and that His death and resurrection were sufficient to pay for sin will help students live their lives in obedience to God and His Word.

Israel Rejects God's Promised Land Weeks 9—13

In unit 2, students will resume their study of the Israelites, while continuing several themes from unit 1. When the Israelites refuse to enter God's Promised Land, they begin forty years of wandering in the wilderness. During this time, God continues to teach His People to trust and obey Him fully. These lessons will show students how God deals with sin and why He deserves our complete trust no matter what.
