Notes to the Teacher

1. This book has been prepared for primary students. The book is perforated so you can tear out each sheet, complete it in class, and send it home with the student. Each page includes directions for completing the activities on that page.
2. The parent letter is on page 3. Send this page home with the student on the first Sunday of the quarter or deliver it personally before the quarter begins. Page 4 contains an overview of this quarter's lessons, along with a list of all the memory verses.
3. If a student is absent, make sure he or she receives the handwork sheet and the Strong Kids at Home take-home paper. This will help the student review the Bible lesson.

Using the Handwork Sheets

The first page of each lesson contains a Lesson Review section. This is an opportunity to review the previous week's lesson. As students arrive to class, let them work on the activity about five minutes into class time. Make sure the students' names are on their papers before you collect them.

You will use the handwork sheets again at the end of the lesson. The students will work on the activities on the back of the sheets. As they work, discuss the Bible story or its application. Let students do as much as time permits, but if they cannot complete the page in class, allow them to take it home and finish it.

Thank you for bringing your child to Sunday School!

This quarter your child will learn more about Jesus' life and ministry on earth. The more your child learns about Jesus, the more he or she will be encouraged to trust and obey Him. During the first unit, your child will see that Jesus' identity as the Son of God was confirmed by people who knew Him, by His own statements, and by the audible voice of God the Father.

The second unit will focus on Jesus' identity as the Son of God as shown through His various miracles and power. Only God has the power to control the wind and sea, heal diseases, raise someone from the dead, and forgive sin—and Jesus did all this, and more!

In the final unit, your child will learn that Jesus cares for him or her sacrificially, like a shepherd cares for his sheep. Your child will study Jesus' teachings to care for our neighbors, and how He changes us to be a testimony of salvation.

Discuss the worksheet with your child each week and encourage your child to tell you what he or she has learned. Set aside time to help your child memorize the Bible memory verse, listed on the back of this sheet. He or she will receive a verse sticker to place on the attendance chart after reciting the verse the following week.

Your child will also bring home the Strong Kids at Home take-home paper every week. Each paper contains an application story, a Bible lesson review, and fun activities related to the Bible lesson. Use the Parent Connect section to help you reinforce the themes each week.

Quarter Overview

Who Jesus Is Weeks 1—3

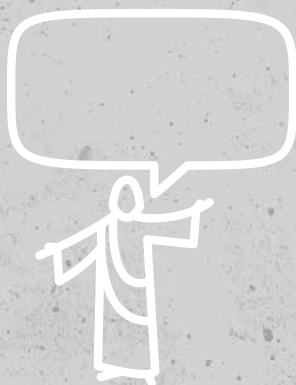
In unit 1, students will learn about Jesus' identity as the Son of God. Jesus' baptism, His selection of disciples to learn and follow His teaching, and His transfiguration on the mountain all point to the significance and validity of Who Jesus is.

What Jesus Did Weeks 4—10

Jesus continued to display His identity with various miracles throughout His ministry on earth. In the second unit, students will be amazed at Jesus' power over sickness, nature, and death—power that only God Himself possesses. Believing in Jesus' power as the Son of God will encourage students to trust Him.

What Jesus Taught Weeks 11—13

The final unit will expose students to some of Jesus' teachings that instruct them how to relate to God and others. It begins with the fact that Jesus is the Good Shepherd Who sacrificially cares for us. Then students will learn that they should care for their neighbors and share the truth of the gospel with others.

How can Grant use his strength to serve God?



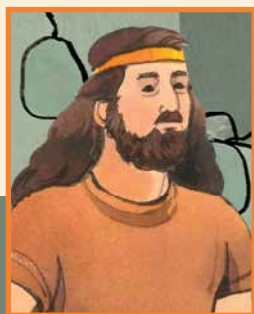
Danielle is a caring and patient person. She likes helping people. It makes her feel good to know that she has made someone's day brighter.
