INDIVIDUAL PAGES



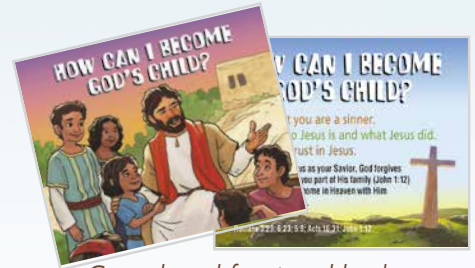
Help students focus on the lesson at hand with this option. Tear out each activity page on the perforated line. Students complete the pages either at VBS or at home.

A lesson card for each day with exciting art, lesson summary, and memory verse to help students remember what they've learned.



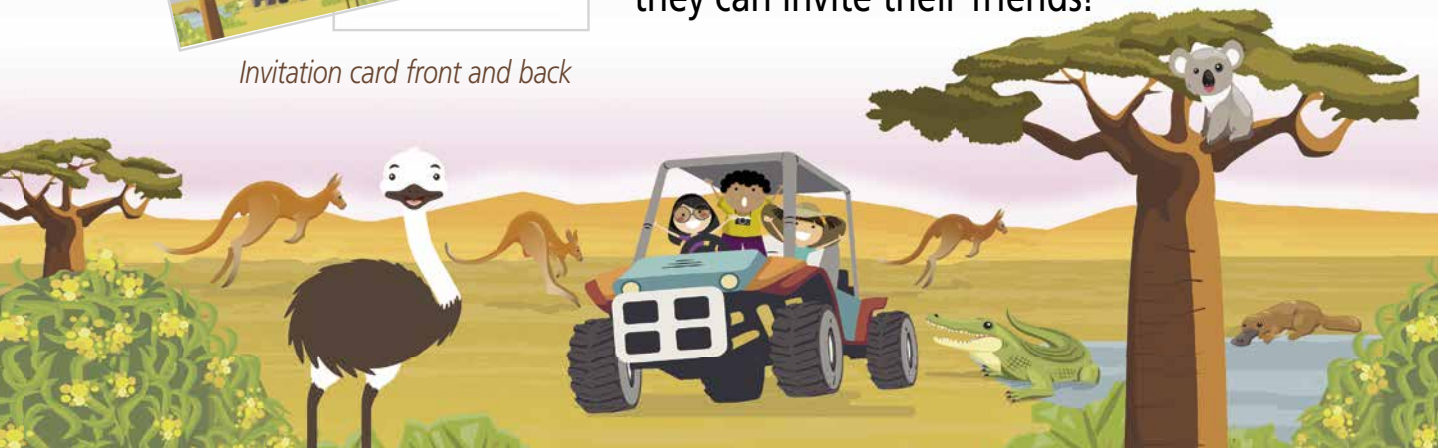
Gospel card front and back

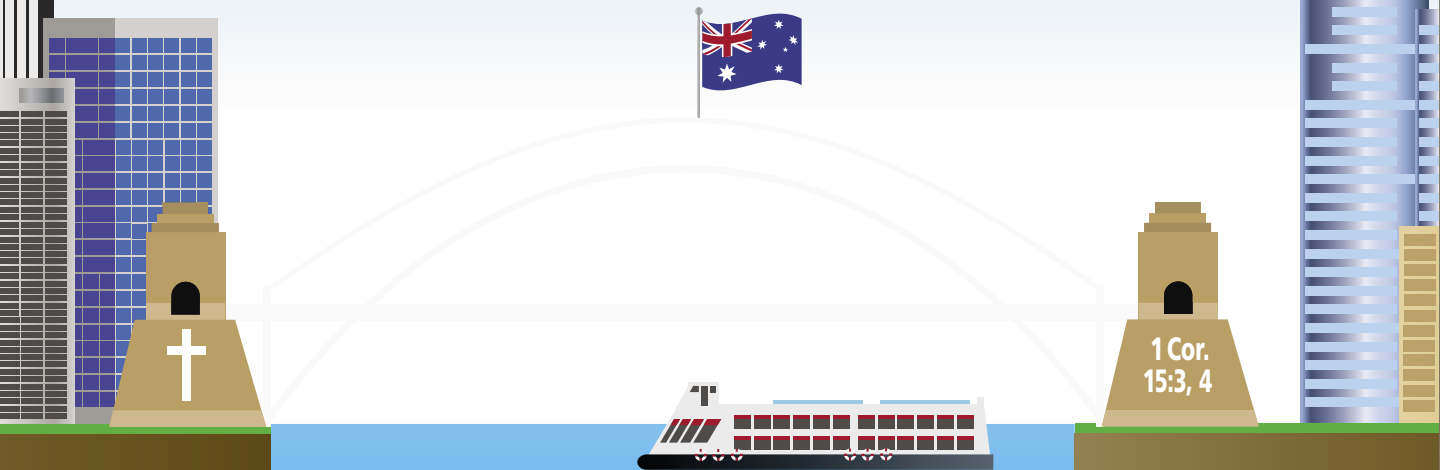
