Notes to the Teacher

1. This book has been prepared for primary students. The book is perforated so you can tear out each sheet, complete it in class, and send it home with the student. Each page includes directions for completing the activities on that page.
2. The parent letter is on page 3. Send this page home with the student on the first Sunday of the quarter or deliver it personally before the quarter begins. Page 4 contains an overview of this quarter's lessons, along with a list of all the memory verses.
3. If a student is absent, make sure he or she receives the handwork sheet and the *Strong Kids at Home* take-home paper. This will help the student review the Bible lesson.

Using the Handwork Sheets

The first page of each lesson contains a Lesson Review section. This is an opportunity to review the previous week's lesson. As students arrive to class, let them work on the activity about five minutes into class time. Make sure the students' names are on their papers before you collect them.

You will use the handwork sheets again at the end of the lesson. The students will work on the activities on the back of the sheets. As they work, discuss the Bible story or its application. Let student do as much as time permits, but if they cannot complete the page in class, allow them to take it home and finish it.

Thank you for bringing your child to Sunday School!

When you think of spring, you may think of warmer temperatures, school activities, upcoming vacations, holiday celebrations, spring cleaning . . . the list goes on! We know you have many things to do and many places you could go each Sunday, and we are excited that you choose to bring your child to our Sunday School.

In units 1 and 3, your child will learn that we can trust God to provide for our needs because God is trustworthy. Lessons about the lives of prophets Elijah and Elisha will reinforce this truth as your child learns the ways in which God provided for these two men in both ordinary and extraordinary ways.

Unit 2 jumps to the New Testament to show how God provided for our greatest need—a Savior from sin—in His Son, Jesus. Your child's faith will grow as he or she learns to understand Jesus as God's light in a world dark with sin.

Unit 4 covers Bible figures such as Josiah, Daniel, Esther, and Nehemiah—all of whom courageously obeyed God to bring Him glory. God's Word teaches your child that he or she can trust God and that He will always keep His word.

Discuss your child's worksheet each week and ask your child what he or she has learned in Sunday School. Remember to help your child memorize Bible memory verses, listed on the back of this sheet. Your child will receive a verse sticker to place on his or her attendance chart after reciting the verse the following week.

The Strong Kids at Home take-home paper your child brings home every week contains an application story, a Bible lesson review, and fun activities related to the Bible lesson. This paper is a tool to help you continue your child's learning throughout the week.

Quarter Overview

God's Prophets Elijah Weeks 1, 2

In unit 1, students will study two events in the life of Elijah, one of God's prophets to Israel. They will learn God keeps His word and that God is the one true God. Students will know they can trust God to provide for their needs.

Jesus, God's Prophet from Heaven Weeks 3—5

Unit 2 breaks from Old Testament examples to study Jesus in the New Testament. Students will learn that God's greatest provision was accomplished by sending His Son, Jesus, to offer eternal life. They will learn that Jesus is like a light to the world.

God's Prophets Elisha Weeks 6, 7

In unit 3 students will study two events in the life of Elisha, one of God's prophets to Israel. They will learn God is the provider of needs and giver of life. They will also learn what it means to walk by faith.

God's Leaders in Captivity Weeks 8—13

Unit 4 covers several people God used as leaders during Israel's captivity. These individuals are great examples to students of how to obey and trust God in everything. God's glory, power, and forgiveness are emphasized.


