

## Notes to the Teacher

1. Remove the letter to parents from the front of each student book and sign each letter. Distribute the letter to the parents of each child in your class on or before the first Sunday of the quarter.
2. In preparation for the quarter, you may want to take apart all the student books and cut around the stickers. Put all the lesson 1 sheets and stickers in a folder; put all the lesson 2 sheets and stickers in another folder; continue for all thirteen lessons. This will save you time during the week.
3. If a child is absent, be sure to give that child the student book sheet (and any stickers or additional pieces) and take-home card the week following the absence.

This student book will help you review with the children the Bible lessons and memory verses. As the children work on their sheets, talk with them about the pictures. After printing a child's name on the paper, have that child repeat the Bible verse with you.

# Lesson Truths

## Weeks 1, 2: Praying to God

Hannah prayed for a son in God's house, and God answered her prayer. Your child will be delighted to know God hears and answers our prayers whether we are happy, sad, or afraid.

## Weeks 3–6: Worshiping God's Son

The Bible stories in this unit cover Jesus' final days. Your child will learn of Mary's special gift to Jesus. We'll celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry, introduce the truth of Jesus' death, and rejoice in His resurrection. Your child will be glad that Jesus, God's Son, is alive in Heaven.

## Weeks 7–10: Serving God

Hannah dedicated Samuel to God's service in the tabernacle. Samuel went to live in God's house to help Eli, the high priest. Your child will be introduced to things he or she can do in God's house—pray, serve the Lord and His people, and listen to and obey God's Word.

## Weeks 11–13: Worshiping God

The Bible stories include King David's plans for building God's house and Solomon's oversight of the construction. Your child will begin to realize that a church is different from other buildings. Your child will be glad to come to church to sing praises to God and to learn God's Word.

## Suggestions for Parents

Help your child see the importance of prayer by listening to you pray aloud throughout the day: before every meal, when you see an ambulance or a fire engine go by, for safety in travel, and for others in need. Your child needs to observe spontaneous prayer as well as structured times of prayer. Allow your child to pray aloud when he or she is ready.
